Calls during the period 13 March 2014 through 30 September 2020

4,072 cases/ 4,896 individuals

Cases pertain to: Specific individuals - 65 percent Women with children - 14 percent Siblings - 8 percent Other - 13 percent

An additional 2,168 individuals were mentioned during the conversations (for whom their possible vulnerability is unclear). These are children of a vulnerable woman or siblings of a vulnerable child. At least 66 percent of them are under the age of 18.

Age

At least 55 percent of them are under the age of 18.



Perpetrators

Most have been victim of several different perpetrators, such as:

- Children and adolescents victimized by parents, siblings and relatives (or their partner's family).
- Women victimized by their husband/ex-husband, their husband's relatives or their own relatives/children.

For all victims, the following applies:

- For at least 66 percent their parents were the perpetrators
- For at least 17 percent their siblings were the perpetrators
- For at least 15 percent, their husband/ex-husband, boyfriend/ex-boyfriend (a few cases, wife/ex-wife) was the perpetrator.
- For at least 16 percent their siblings were the perpetrators.



Type of violence or abuse

Many have been subjected to several types of violence or abuse.

The most common (often in combination with another type) are:

- Physical violence: At least 34 percent (1,657 individuals)
- Sexual violence*: At least 6 percent (217 individuals)
- Fear of/plans for a child marriage/forced marriage or a child marriage/forced marriage that has been carried out: 19 percent (945 individuals) (of that number, 191 were subjected to a forced marriage/child marriage).
- Abduction/being detained abroad against their will or risk/threat of being abducted: 13 percent (613 individuals) (Of that number, 357 individuals were abducted/detained abroad against their will).

Type of violence or abuse, cont.

- Threat or fear of being killed: 10 percent (501 individuals)
- Female genital mutilation/risk of female genital mutilation: 262 girls/women (7 percent of the girls/women), of which
 - Consequences of female genital mutilation 80 girls and women
 - Fear that they will be subjected to female genital mutilation 113 girls
 - Suspicion that female genital mutilation has occurred 64 girls

In addition, many of these individuals were subjected to **physical violence, threats, control and limitations.** These types of violence and abuse are not always, however, revealed specifically in all cases, since the focus is frequently on things of an even more serious nature, such as physical violence, risk of forced marriage or that a person has been abducted.
